- 1. What do you remember from the book thus far that has proven Jesus to be God?
- 2. What has been most convincing for you?
- 3. In what ways did people misinterpret the proofs of His identity? (Verse 29, 6:14,15)
- 4. In what preconceived idea of the messiah were their beliefs rooted in?
- 5. Based on what we know of Peter, how is it encouraging that he confesses Christ as the messiah in verse 29?
- 6. Based on Matthews account in chapter 16:17, where does the ability to see him as the Christ come from?
- 7. In verse 31, what is implied by the words "began" and "must"?
- 8. Why does Jesus wait until after this confession to share the necessity of His death?
- 9. What are the dangers of separating the person of Christ from the work of Christ?
