## The Lord Is Worthy Of Worship

Psalm 103 (Page 502)

### The Lord Is Worthy Of Your Worship (Vs 1-5)

- For His Gracious Mercy Expressed To The Sinner

### The Lord Is Worthy Of Our Worship (Vs 6-14)

- For His Loving Character Enjoyed By His Covenant People

### The Lord Is Worthy Of All Worship (Vs 15-22)

- For His Sovereign Greatness Experienced By All Creation

### The Big Question: How?

- Isaiah 53:4-12 – Through a perfect suffering substitute
- Luke 22:18-20 – A New Covenant established in Christ
- Luke 24:44-49 – Fulfilling every requirement and promise
- Ephesians 1:3-14 – That all who believe might benefit
- Revelation 19:1-8; 21:1-7 – Resulting in eternal praise

# Sermon Study Guide

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. What are some essential marks of true worship we see in this Psalm?
3. Please answer the following with truths expressed in Psalm 103: How can we stir ourselves up individually to bless the Lord more fervently (“...all that is within me...”) ? How can we as a Life Group stir one another up to bless the Lord more constantly (“...forget not all his benefits...”) ? How can we as a church gathered on Sunday morning stir one another up to bless the Lord more humbly (“...we are dust...”) ?
4. How does tracing out the unfolding story of God’s redemption in Jesus Christ reveal an even greater majesty in Psalm 103?
5. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
6. What themes do you find helpful or interesting?
7. What sin did the Holy Spirit convict you of in this sermon?
8. How were you encouraged by this passage?
9. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
