Salvation: Wide and Narrow Acts 10:1-48 (p.918)

Racism: The <u>Inclusiveness</u> of God's Salvation

God's salvation is given to <u>all</u> those who believe the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Christianity is the most diverse movement in all of history .

Evangelism: The Exclusiveness of God's Salvation

God's salvation is given to <u>only</u> those who believe the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The only thing that matters in the end is whether or not you have been <u>forgiven</u> through faith in Jesus Christ.
