Exodus 5-6 (p. 48)

3 Applications

- God is acting toward the fulfillment of his covenant with Abraham, to be finally fulfilled through an individual offspring and with an international outcome.
- The road of redemption for Abraham's children leads to victory, but it also leads them through suffering until then.
- The success of God's plans do not depend on the proficiency of his workers but on the purpose of his will.

3 Questions

- Are you trusting in Christ as Savior to inherit God's eternal blessings?
- Are you suffering as a believer in Christ and have a broken spirit, and you aren't hearing God's promises of hope?
- Are you a worker seeking to proclaim the gospel of Christ to your neighbors and the nations, but you feel inadequate?

Sermon Study Guide

(Reminder: The purpose of the questions is to explore the text and themes of the sermon. **Do not feel a need to go through all of the questions, but try to discuss/study some in each category.** The goal is to stimulate discussion/reflection and transformation related to the sermon text and themes.)

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. Why is it hard for us to really hear the promises of glory when we are suffering? How should the fact that Christ suffered before entering into his glory, strengthen us when we are worn down emotionally and worn out physically? How can we help each other "hear" the hope we have, when we are hurting?
3. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
4. What themes do you find helpful or interesting?
5. What sin did the Holy Spirit convict you of in this sermon?
6. How were you encouraged by this passage?
7. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
