- **The unbelief of Israel is not TOTAL !**

In Paul's time... A remnant of Jews had obtained God's favor, but the rest were hardened.

- **The unbelief of Israel is not FINAL !**

God's sovereign plan...the outline

1. Jewish rejection
2. Gentile salvation
3. Jewish inclusion

A Warning: "do not become proud..."

God's sovereign plan...the outcome

1. "the fullness of the Gentiles"
2. "all Israel will be saved"
3. "mercy on all" (both Gentiles and Israel)

Sermon Study Guide

(Reminder: The purpose of the questions is to explore the text and themes of the sermon. **Do not feel a need to go through all of the questions, but try to discuss/study some in each category.** The goal is to stimulate discussion/reflection and transformation related to the sermon text and themes.)

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. What is meant by "the fullness of the Gentiles" and how will this fullness come about (Matt. 24:14)? When we read "all Israel will be saved", how are we to believe they are saved (Rom. 10:13-15)?
3. Romans 11:32 ends with "that he (God) may have mercy on all". Though some use this to argue every person will go to heaven, this ending means all without distinction, but not all without exception. How could we keep from losing the wonder of God's mercy?
4. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
5. What themes do you find helpful or interesting?
6. What sin did the Holy Spirit convict you of in this sermon?
7. How were you encouraged by this passage?
8. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
