Sermon Study Guide

(Reminder: The purpose of the questions is to explore the text and themes of the sermon. **Do not feel a need to go through all of the questions, but try to discuss/study some in each category.** The goal is to stimulate discussion/reflection and transformation related to the sermon text and themes.)

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. Look at Psalm 119:1a and 13. Does a person love and enjoy God's word if during the week he hardly ever reads it? If we read it regularly, do we really love it if we don't think long and hard about it during the day? Talk about this "Discipline yourself to read and reflect on scripture, praying for delight as you do so."
3. Think about the application of God's word to your daily life (obedience). Look at Matthew 28:19-20 and discuss that this is the ultimate goal of discipleship.
4. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
5. What themes do you find helpful or interesting?
6. What sin did the Holy Spirit convict you of in this sermon?
7. How were you encouraged by this passage?
8. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
