## JESUS IS BETTER

Perfection Hebrews 10:1-18 P.1006

Perfection is provided through forgiveness in Christ

Not through these sacrifices

## But through his sacrifice

Because Jesus was truly <u>man</u> and truly <u>God</u>, he was a match and a willing perfect, sacrifice providing forgiveness for every sin of everyone who puts their hope in Him alone.

Perfection is productive toward holiness in Christ

Perfect forgiveness leads to perfecting holiness

This means becoming what we already are.

Because of continuing sacrifices they were <u>reminded</u> over and over of their sins.

Because of Christ's sacrifice God won't <u>remember</u> our sins for ever and ever.

## **Sermon Study Guide**

5. What has the Holy Spirit convict you of in this sermon?

6. How were you encouraged by this passage?

7. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
