

ANOTHER Summer in Psalms

Praise to the God Who Delivers Us

Psalm 57

*Praise the God who hears our cry for mercy, brings reversal to our plight,
and displays His glory among all peoples.*

1. Praise the God who hears our cry for mercy. (1-5)

God sent from heaven his "steadfast love and faithfulness" in the person of Jesus Christ.

2. Praise the God who brings reversal to our plight. (6)

The ultimate reversal was when Jesus through His death conquered death, sin and Satan.

3. Praise the God who displays His glory among all peoples. (7-11)

God's plan for His steadfast love and faithfulness to be proclaimed to the nations is us, the redeemed people He commissioned.

Sermon Study Guide

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
3. Look up Genesis 32:9-10, Exodus 34:6-7, and Lamentations 3:22-23. Why is it so significant that David puts His hope in God's steadfast love and faithfulness in Psalm 57:3?
4. Are there times in your life that you "worshiped through tears" during a time of suffering or loss, or observed another believer doing so? If so, why was that possible, and what impact did it have on you personally, or on others?
5. In Psalm 57:7-11, David declares his firm commitment to praising God among the nations and seeing His glory spread throughout the earth. As Christians, where do we find our motivation for doing the same thing today?
6. What has the Holy Spirit convicted you of in this sermon?
7. How were you encouraged by this passage?
8. How does this passage connect to or inform our understanding of the gospel?
