Sermon Study Guide

(Reminder: The purpose of the questions is to explore the text and themes of the sermon. **Do not feel a need to go through all of the questions.**

The goal is to stimulate discussion/reflection and transformation related to the sermon text and themes.)

1. What evidences of grace have you seen since we last met?
2. What stuck out to you from the sermon Sunday?
3. Read Isaiah 6:1-7. Are there any parallels you notice between this passage and Luke 2:8-11? What part does glory and fear play in preparing people to hear the good news (as announced in Isaiah 6:7 and Luke 2:10-11)?
4. What comes to mind when you think of shepherds in the Bible? Can you think of key Bible characters who worked as shepherds? What does God's calling or choice of them say about His ways?
5. What does it signify that God took the title of shepherd upon himself (Psalm 23, Ezekiel 34:15-16), as did Jesus (John 10:11) and the New Testament church leaders (Eph 4:11, 1 Peter 5:1-2)?
6. What has the Holy Spirit convicted you of in this sermon?
7. How were you encouraged by this passage?
