- 4. The experiences of Vashti and Esther in chapters 1-2 are very centered on their physical beauty, and the power of the king to control their destinies. What does God's Word teach us about the true value of every human being and the proper use of power? Start with Genesis 1:27, 1 Peter 3:4, and Luke 22:25-26.
- 5. What has the Holy Spirit convicted you of in this sermon?
