- 4. As Esther steps up to rescue her people, she puts herself at great risk, while Mordecai enrages Haman and ends up in mortal danger. On the other hand, Haman goes further and further down a path of seeking to destroy Mordecai and the Jews, with a high level of confidence and determination. All three face some degree of risk, but what are the key differences between what motivates them and where they put their trust?
