Sermon Study Guide

1. In Psalm 145, David exhorted God's people to do many things. Was there any one of them that especially challenged or convicted you? What might you do in response to that conviction?

2. What are some ways you seek to intentionally invest time into "commending" or "declaring" God's mighty acts and wondrous works to the next generation (verses 4-7)? Can you think of Christians who had a significant impact on you in this way when you were younger?

3. In verses 14-20, what is the significance of God's general kindness and goodness (common grace), versus his covenant love toward his people? According to verses 18-20, what does it look like to be one of God's covenant people?

4. Based on this psalm, how would you summarize the motivation (why) and the means (how) for our praising the Lord?
