1. What do the rebels say? (1-3)
2. What does the LORD say? (4-6)
3. What does the Son/King say? (7-9)
4. What does the Psalmist say? (10-12)
5. What do you say? (John 5:23-24)

Sermon Study Guide

(Reminder: The purpose of the questions is to explore the text and themes of the sermon. **Do not feel a need to go through all of the questions.** The goal is to stimulate discussion/reflection and transformation related to the sermon text and themes.)

1. What is your answer to the psalmist's question in v. 1: "Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain?" Why does God's creation rebel against Him?
2. How should we interpret or understand the LORD's response in vv. 4-6? Is God making a joke, does He not care? Why should all who live on the earth be concerned about the LORD in heaven?
3. The Bible reveals that the 'Son' of v. 7 is Jesus (Ps. 72:8; Dan. 7:14; Act. 13:33; Rom. 1:4; Heb. 1:5; 5:5; Rev. 12:5; 19:15). Why will the LORD give His Son the nations (v. 7-9)? What will the Son do and why?
4. Each movement in the Psalm involves someone saying something. While vv. 1-9 are mostly descriptive, vv. 10-12 are full of imperatives / commands: be wise; be warned; serve the LORD with fear; worship Him; Kiss the Son. What's the psalmist's point? Discuss how this impacts your life.
